TABLE TALK

This past year we launched a new program called Table Talk at each of our weekly sites. Not only do we want to feed people physically, even more we want people to be fed spiritually.

Table Talk was created to get people engaged in learning about the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Every week after the meal is served, we share a five minute video from The Bible Project followed by a 10-15 minute discussion on the topic shared in the video.

The response has been amazing. Not only have we doubled the number of people staying for these discussions, but we have seen our volunteers grow in their faith as well! We are seeing over 120 people stay for the video and discussion each week, and have heard testimonies about how Table Talk has truly brought a better understanding of the Gospel.

We are cultivating a community where people feel welcome to grow in the Lord and support each other.

From homelessness to spending time in jail, Peggy has had her share of difficulties. Since graduating a local recovery program, she has continued to serve with Feed the Need Missions every week and has seen the impact Table Talk is making in her life and those around her.

“Not only does Table Talk give me hope, but it does others too. When we discuss the videos out loud

amongst each other it gives us that realization that we’re not walking alone,” she explained.

“Table Talk also allows us to bond in Jesus and to come together to go deeper and to grow deeper,” she adds. “Being able to fellowship allows me to feel loved and have a purpose. It allows me to feel like a person again and to feel that connection with Jesus.”



A NEW SITE IN NEWARK, TEXAS

In Fall of 2018, we launched our newest site in the North Fort Worth Area in Newark, Texas. This is our second site in the North Fort Worth Area and we are so grateful to see God's provision as He grows our ministry in this part of Texas.

Before this site launched, we intentionally spent time training the volunteers and site leadership. This was the first site we were able to implement these trainings before we ever served our first meal to the community.

The results have been extremely encouraging. These trainings have provided tools and processes which the volunteers have been using to reach and connect with people in the community faster and better than ever before. Not only has it been amazing to see our site leaders respond to the call of serving their community, but to see how much more effective they have been by using the resources we have established to help them.

TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

Training is essential to help maintain consistency in the mission God has called us to.

This past year was pivotal as we started off the year knowing we needed to do a better job training and equipping people to do ministry. As a result, we designed four layers of training for our volunteers and anyone looking to get involved with us in ministry.

The main goal is to see people better equipped for building meaningful relationships with the people that come to our sites and point them to Christ along the way. In addition, we also designed a "Site Cookbook" that has everything you need to know about running and leading one of our weekly sites.

GOBBLE KITS

In November 2018, Feed the Need Missions partnered with churches and local businesses to provide those in our community with a Thanksgiving meal through our Gobble Kit program.

It was the first year we did this and the impact we saw in our various communities was incredible. We had hundreds of families sign up across our seven Feed the Need locations, and with the help of the community, EVERY person who signed up was provided a Thanksgiving meal to enjoy with their family. We were blown away by the response of our local communities to provide a special meal for each family at Thanksgiving.

CHURCH INVOLVEMENT

Partnering with local churches is critical to growing our ministry and helping grow the faith of those in our community.

As we build relationships and see people commit to following Jesus, it is important for them to get plugged into a local church. We need local churches engaged with what we are doing, to come alongside us, and to help with discipleship and pointing people to Jesus. When Christians from various local churches show up at our sites and serve together in unity, it truly is a beautiful visual of the Church working together to love our community.



CHURCH & BURGERS

This year we launched a new ongoing event where we go to our local churches, provide a meal for their congregation, and share what God is doing through Feed the Need Missions.

We started the year serving tacos, but ended up sticking to what we know best...burgers. The food is completely on us, but we do encourage donations. We also share ways people can get involved and provide sign ups for a training scheduled soon after each event.

GALA AND DINNER

It was an introduction to our organization and our hearts and vision as we expand into the North Fort Worth Area. This event also raised a significant amount of funds that go directly to supporting our two North Fort Worth Area sites.

OUR WEEKLY SITES

We started 2018 with six sites and added a seventh site at the end of the third quarter. Five of our sites are located in the Bastrop Area and our two newest locations are in the North Fort Worth Area.

Overall in 2018, we served over 2,600 people at our weekly gatherings. Not only did these people receive a hot meal, they also had the opportunity to hear the Gospel through prayer, Table Talk, and one-on-one conversations. We accomplished this with the help of 446 dedicated volunteers who took time out of their schedules to serve their community.

On average each site had 13 volunteers weekly, three of which spent intentional time praying and visiting with our guests. We averaged 60 guests at each gathering giving each of those guests the opportunity to hear the Gospel through the message at the beginning of serving, volunteer interactions, and Table Talk at the end of the serving hour. We averaged two one-on-one conversations where a volunteer shared the Gospel, and an average of 17 people stayed for Table Talk at each site every week.



